Traditional face-to-face exam administrations will not take place this year. Students will take a 45-minute online free-response exam at home. Students will be able to use their books and notes.

For each AP subject, there will be 2 different testing dates. The regular testing date and the late testing date. Here are the regular dates for our exams:

Calculus May 12, 1:00

Eng. Lang. May 20, 1:00

US History May 15, 1:00

Art Portfolios May 26

The test will cover what is traditionally covered prior to spring break—the first 75% of content. Be sure to check the link at the top of the page to see what type of questions and what content will be covered for each exam.

There are two different methods of taking the exam: handwritten or typed. You can take the exam on your cell phone and write out your answers, take a picture of the handwritten answers and submit them. The disadvantage of this method is that you have to scroll to read the prompts. You also have the option of taking the exam on a laptop and then typing your responses and submitting them. You could read the prompts on your laptops, write your answers on paper, take a picture on cell phone and then transfer the picture to the laptop but you only have 5 minutes to complete this process so you might run short of time. Collegeboard is planning to have some practice tests available so you can get familiar with the process of uploading your answers.

AP is offering free, live AP review lessons, delivered by AP teachers from across the country. These courses:

- Are optional, mobile-friendly, and can be used alongside any work your teacher may give you.
- Will be available on-demand, so you can access them any time.
- Will focus on reviewing the skills and concepts from the first 75% of the course.
   There will also be some supplementary lessons including topics from the final 25% of the course.
